#### Mrs Smith's Message

A lovely week, with the children really settling down to their work. Behaviour across the school is very good and the children need to be congratulated for this.

Thank you to everyone for helping me with the parking in the drop off area, it has been so much better this week. I really appreciate this as I hate having to be on 'traffic warden duty' - I would much rather be greeting you and talking to the children as they arrive!

It is good to see more of the children in Key Stage 1 taking up the free meals option. Families save at least £500 per year if their child has the free meal compared to providing a packed lunch from home.

We are very sorry to hear that Radstock Nursery is going to close, we have worked very closely with them since they arrived on site having been locked out of another local school. There are some rumours circulating that the nursery is having to close because of the rents we charge. We do not own the buildings and therefore do not charge the nursery anything for being there.

More good news. We have made the decision to use some of the money we raise as a staff to pay for clubs after school for this term. We hope that this will encourage more of you to persuade your children to join the clubs. We will not always be able to do this as money is tight so please take advantage of it now! Thank you to everyone for continuing to ensure pupils are smartly dressed . Please can I remind everyone that children must have school shoes which should be black or PLAIN black trainers—which have black soles.

We had a really fun time with Jim Gump today. He is a truly inspirational man-I am sure the children will tell you all about it and will be keen to try out some of his ideas.

#### **Census Day** Free School Meals

As you are aware all of the children in reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school meal every day. What you won't be aware of is that the school is not paid for all of these meals unless your child has a meal on census day! The school is paid for meals based on the average number of children having school meals on these days - this means that if 50 children have a meal on census days but 100 children have meals on the other days we only receive the money for 50 of the children taking the meals each day! This has cost our school approximately £10,000 this year (more than a teaching assistant costs us.) Think how much equipment

we could have bought with that money! The next census day is on Thursday 18th January 2018. On that day we will be booking every child a meal who is entitled to one and offer it to your child. If you are worried that your child will not eat the lunch please feel free to send a packed lunch as well. If they don't eat their lunch we will offer them the packed lunch – if they do they can take their lunch home for tea!

On census day lunch will be sausages or fish fingers with chips or a vegetarian option of Cheese pin wheel, Dessert will be chocolate crunch.
